Device overview

The Payaz GivingStation is an eye-catching contactless donation device with a large touchscreen. The device is a composition of different parts: Payaz provide the hardware, Give A Little provide the software (a donations app pre-installed on the device tablet), and SumUp provide the merchant account (a bit like a bank account; SumUp is the company that processes payments and deposits funds into your church's bank account).



- *Connectivity:* an internet connection is required at the point of making a donation, either by connecting to WiFi or using a SIM card. SIM cards can be supplied at a cost of £42+VAT on an annual basis.
- *On-screen Gift Aid declaration capture:* donors can make a Gift Aid declaration on the device.
- *Securable for self-service use:* the device can be secured for unattended use using a Kensington-style lock (supplied with rollout devices).
- *Transaction fees:* SumUp charges between 1.1-1.3% per contactless donation (depending on card type; 1.95 for online donations).
- *Customisable screen layout:* the screen can be customised to change the donation amounts displayed and also personalised with images/videos.
- *Online giving:* Give A Little can also be used for online giving, meaning that once you have set up an account for contactless giving you can also use the same account to collect online donations. For the latter, you may wish to connect Stripe as an additional payment processor for cheaper transaction rates (1.1% for online giving). Find out more by [clicking here](#).
- *No ongoing costs:* There are no ongoing monthly costs for using the device (beyond SIM card charges, for those who choose to activate the SIM). The Premium version of Give A Little is currently provided free of charge, subsidised by the National church. Should this change in the future, you can choose to use the free version of Give A Little (with reduced functionality) if you prefer.
